**DEEP LEARNING GAIN**

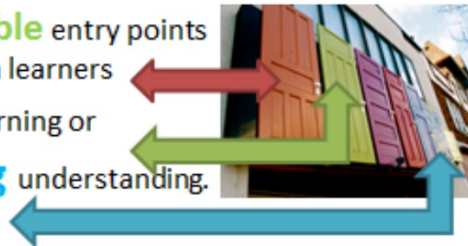


Replace **learning objectives** with **learning steps**

that lead the student **towards** the **LEARNING GAIN**.

Use **variable** entry points based upon learners

**prior** learning or **existing** understanding.



**Prior, Current, End**  
**ASSESSMENT**  
**Peer, Teacher, Self**

Regularly in order to reshape the learning steps.

**HIGH** Expectations that all learners will achieve the learning gain.

**DIFFERENTIATION**

Use **SOLO TAXONOMY** to construct main teaching activities that allow all learners to make rapid progress towards the learning gain.



## SOLO Taxonomy: Structure of Observed Learning Outcome -

This is a way of learning that allows students to assess their progress through increasingly complex understanding of a topic.

We are able to use SOLO to look at our ideas and explain what level our thinking is at.

## **Assessment:**

The course is assessed through one exam - 90 minutes

4 questions -

1a and 1b have sources attached for stimulus and are worth 12 and 24 marks

2a is an EXPLAIN question and 2b is a HOW FAR DO YOU AGREE question, they are also worth 12 and 24 marks.

There is a choice of completing either 2a and 2b or 3a and 3b. They require you to do the same but just using a different topic.

72 marks in total.
