





All historians agree that Hitler dominated Germany 1933-45.


Hitler's power was based on his unique relationship with the German people.


He alone knew what the Germans wanted and he alone could fulfill their needs.





This system of government may seem absurd but after 14 years of weak government in the Weimar Republic, and German humiliation abroad many Germans were seeking a MESSIAH.


The Nazi Party had been built around the *Fuhrerprinzip* (leadership principle) now this applied to all of Germany.


















Why did the "Myth" gain credence?

Credence - belief, credibility.

- It was a reaction to the old divisions of the tired and weak Weimar Republic.
- It satisfied the German peoples' emotional need for a strong leader.
- o It reinforced the German tradition of authoritarian leadership.

We love you Adolf, we do We love you Adolf we do Oh Hitler we love you.

- o It developed out of the Fuhrerprinzip of the Nazi Party.
- o It was sustained by the success of Hitler after 1933.
- o It was enhanced by propaganda.



What were the consequences of the Hitler Myth:

The myth contributed to Hitler's great popularity.

By the late 1930s an estimated 90% of all Germans admired him.
